Oldham Coliseum Theatre provides distinctive and high-quality theatre performance and participatory activities, inspiring individuals and communities and making meaningful contributions to social and cultural regeneration in Oldham, Greater Manchester and nationally. Fostering a culture of aspiration, the theatre delivers a wide range of life-changing cultural experience, emphasising and promoting collaboration, sustainability and community cohesion.

Following the closure of the original building on Fairbottom Street on 31 March 2023, Oldham Coliseum Theatre is currently focused on delivering a cultural programme across the borough and working with Oldham Council on their plans for a new theatre opening in 2026.

The new building will be part of Oldham's Cultural Quarter and will provide a more modern, accessible venue for performers, participants in our engagement programme and audiences from Oldham and beyond.

Background

We now have an opportunity in Oldham to examine and perhaps reset the way arts and culture is delivered, and to work with key partners, existing and new, to create an exciting new cultural enterprise for the town. One that is fully representative and reflects the diversity of Oldham (cultural and socio-economic).

One of the key objectives is to create and deliver a learning and engagement programme, led and delivered through a strategic partnership between Oldham Theatre Workshop & Oldham Coliseum Theatre Ltd.

This partnership will seek to engage a diverse range of communities from across Oldham in the arts as creators, participants and audience members.







Purpose of the Role

At the heart of this role is the simple idea of connection, between people, their local communities, and their local theatre / arts providers.

We are seeking an individual to work with us on a freelance basis, to lead a programme of consultation and connection across Oldham's schools and wider education settings. Findings from these consultations will feed directly into the planning of future cultural activity in the town.

The role will seek to build and populate sustainable networks that directly connect teachers and education professionals to the town's cultural offer. This foundation work will help strengthen existing programmes and to create new opportunities that enhance people's lives through participation in the performing arts.

The post holder will be responsible for developing and delivering activities which broaden the diversity of all people engaging with Oldham's cultural offer.

Responsibilities

- To design and deliver a range of consultation workshops / sessions that connect / re-connect and collaborate with all schools and formal education settings in Oldham.
- To enable creativity, build networks and open pathways to Oldham's wider cultural offer.
- To manage the partnership's evaluation processes, using e.g. KPIs, SMART targets, ToC and other evaluation processes to measure successes and produce relevant data and reports.
- To build strong relationships with key partners, stakeholders, schools and participants.

- Creative and resourceful, with an interest and enthusiasm for engaging schools and wider public audiences through arts.
- Knowledge and experience of schools and formal education settings.
- Experience of delivering sessions, workshops and events that engage teachers, head teachers and education professionals.
- Experience of producing data and reports measuring against key project outcome criteria.
- A grounding in the evaluation of arts, learning or community-facing activities and events.
- Knowledge of Health and Safety practices, risk assessment, safeguarding and safe working practices as they pertain to art projects, community events and workshops.







- Good understanding of inclusion and diversity with the commitment to applying these in practice.
- Self-starter, able to operate independently as well as part of a small team.
- Strong administrative skills.
- Excellent knowledge of the theatre and arts industry.
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills.
- A highly organised approach to work and demonstrable ability to work under pressure and to deadline.

- Good understanding of current cultural policy and issues.
- Experience of theatre or arts in education (formal or informal settings).
- Knowledge and understanding of the education system, key stages and the National Curriculum.
